Re: Request to install gate on dead-end portion of right-of-way at 943 N. 1500 Rd

Dear Mr. Soules:

My wife and I request that we are permitted to construct a gate (at our cost) at the dead-end portion of the right-of-way on N. 1500 Rd. The requested location of the gate would be approximately 300 feet west of the current barrier. Such gate would be constructed near the west line of the property owned by Jell, Inc. (Jell, Inc. owns the north half of the right-of-way and is 100% owned by us.) We are the only home served by the area in question.


Our reasons for this request are primarily two-fold.

1. The dead-end currently has no established turn around area and, consequently, those seeking a short-cut, or just joy-riders, turn around on our land, which is grass and sod, often leaving ruts and tire marks.
2. About once a month, trash, in one form or another, is dumped at the end of the road which we pick up. A gate located at our proposed site would help to reduce this problem since the new location would be more conspicuous and, therefore, less likely to collect trash.
