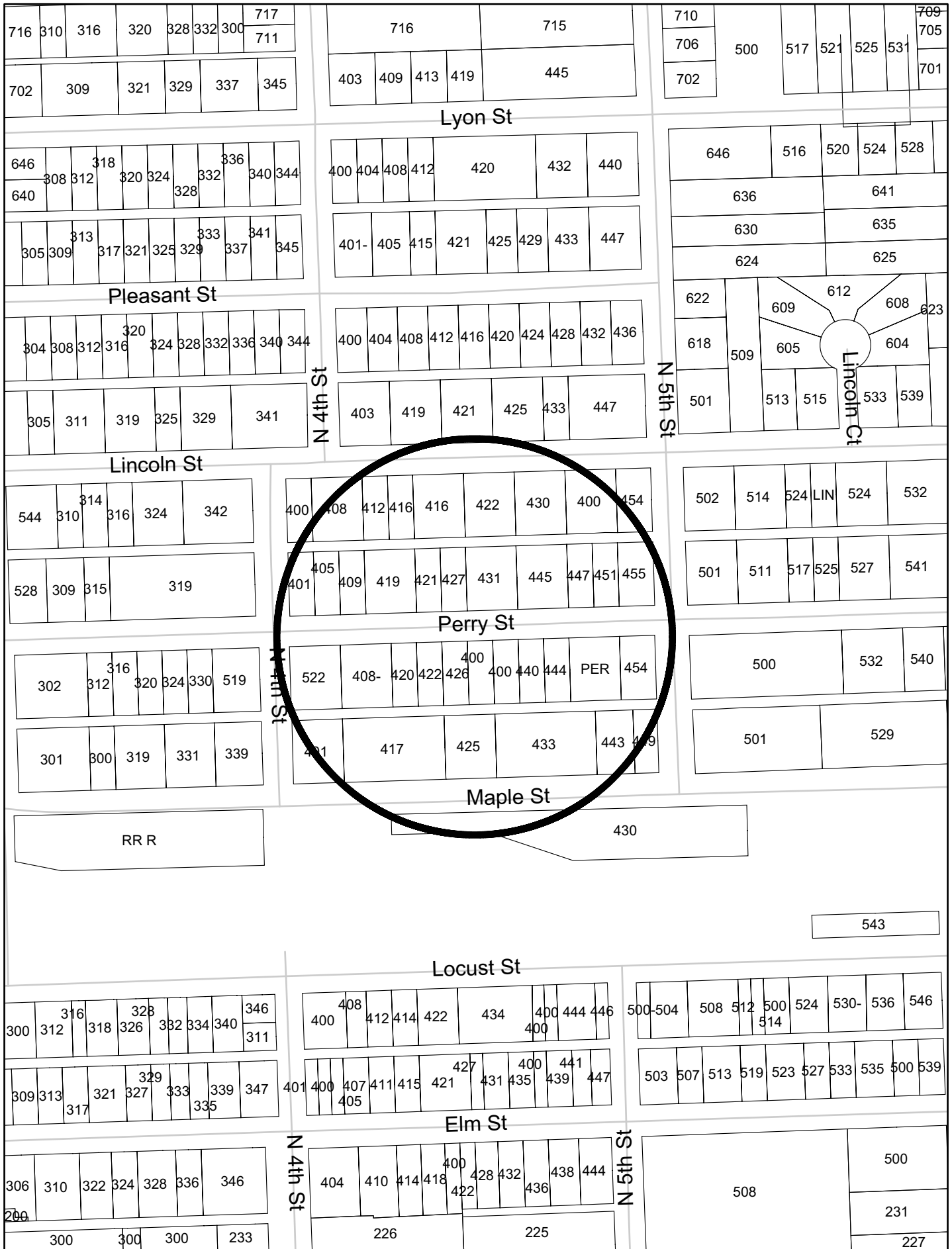
Now you all know of this situation. This letter will go in my file for insurance and legal purposes.

Dear City Commissioners,

I sorry I have to miss your meeting concerning parking on Perry Street, but I have to work. If I could attend the meeting this is what I would say.

1. Why doesn't North Lawrence qualify for street improvements? Putting up no parking signs on Perry Street will not fix the need for wider streets, curbs and sidewalks. This is a safety issue.

2. I did not know tow trucks were allowed to be parked in residential areas. When Quality Tow parks their tow trucks (one ~~one~~ on each side of Perry Street) no one can get through. The streets must be made wider to safely park these tow trucks.

3. Because I complained my life has been threatened by the very neighbor who drives this tow truck pictured.

4. North Lawrence has been ignored

too long. There are streets narrower than Perry Street. Lining the streets with no parking signs is not the solution. But ~~under~~ wider streets with curbs and sidewalks is the only safe solution I see.
