Again I am asking the city to ~~also~~ also consider the matter on 4th Street.

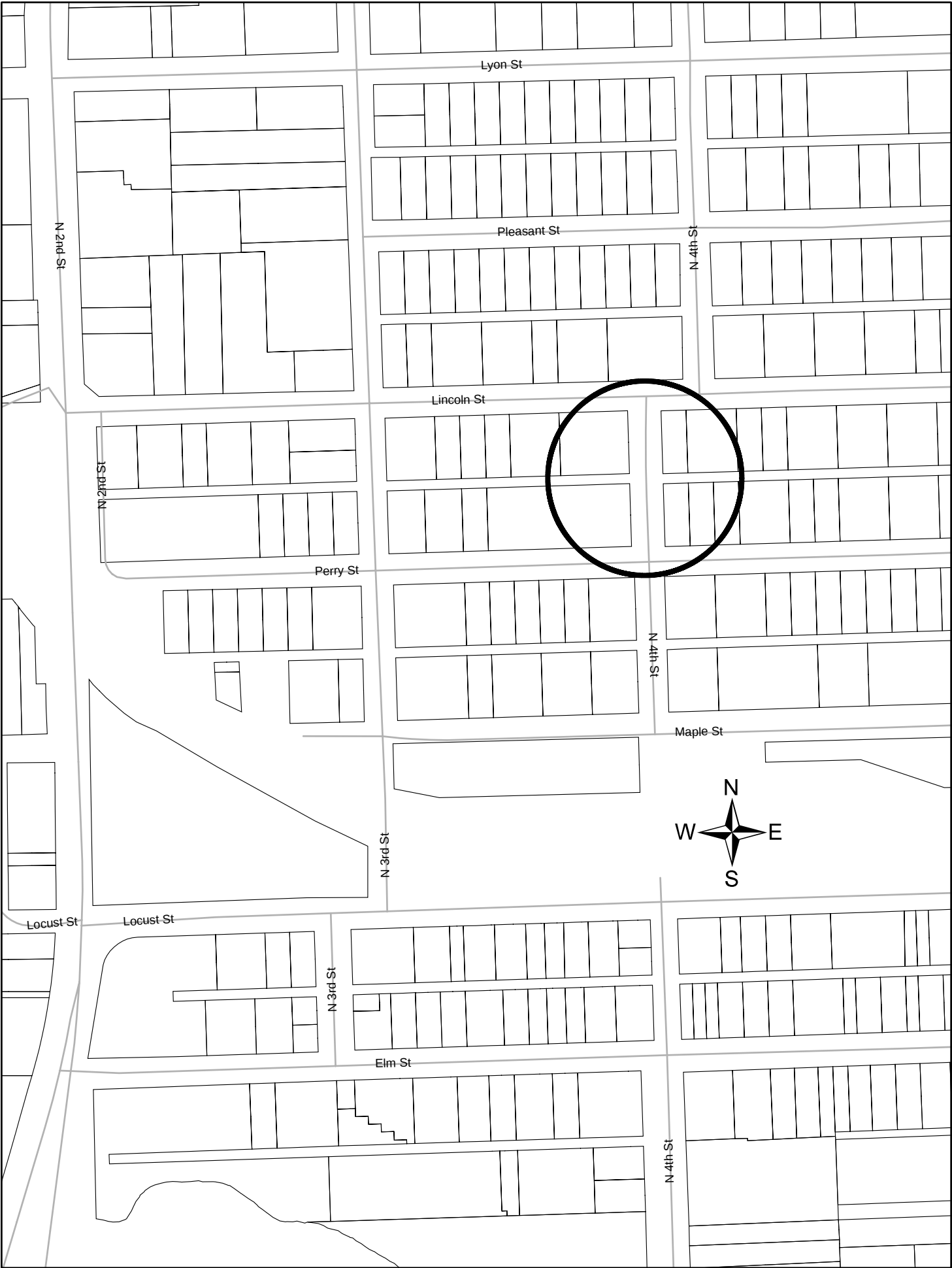

I request before you tonight in, Please make streets in North Lawrence wider with curb and sidewalks. Please make 4th Street "NO Parking" until it is made wider with curb and sidewalks.

7th and 8th Street is too narrow to safely park this truck and trailer on it, but if it was made about 16 feet wider then this truck without trailer could safely be parked on 4th Street.

Several complaints have been ~~called~~ called in to the Lawrence Police Dept. about this truck and trailer. It is in violation of city ordinance 17-416 A. According to the officer who did measure the length of said truck and trailer stated that just the trailer is 20 feet in length. He also stated it left 10 feet in width roadway for two way traffic. Clearly unsafe, when at least

16 feet in width of roadway
is required for two way traffic,
eight feet in width for each
direction.

Please consider making the streets
in North Lawrence safe for all
with wider streets, curbs and
sidewalks.

- (C) The fee for failure to pay the parking fee shall be not less than ten dollars (\$10.00) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00), exclusive of court costs. (Ord. 6386; Ord. 6813)

PARKING OF LARGE VEHICLES RESTRICTED.

- (A) It shall be unlawful for any person to park any vehicle which exceeds eight (8) feet in width, or twenty (20) feet in length, or eight (8) feet in height, on any street in any residence district for more than two (2) hours, except when actively loading and/or unloading or within the performance of a service to or upon property abutting the area where the vehicle is parked.
- (B) Provided, the provisions of subsection (A) shall not apply if the vehicle displays a use of right-of-way permit for the vehicle pursuant to Section 16-801 et seq. of the City Code. A use of right-of-way permit for temporary large vehicle parking shall only be issued pursuant to Section 16-801 et seq. if all of the following conditions are met:
- 1) the permit shall only be valid for a maximum of seven (7) consecutive days;
 - 2) the permit applicant has obtained the consent of adjoining property owners for the temporary use of right-of-way;
 - 3) the vehicle shall be limited to two (2) permits in any consecutive twelve month period; and
 - 4) the permit applicant agrees to comply with any and all City Code provisions and conditions.

Violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of \$30.00. Each day's violation shall constitute a separate offense. (Ord. 6783, Ord. 7363)

RECREATION VEHICLES; PARKING ON STREET.

No motorized self-propelled camper, nonmotorized travel trailer, or boat or canoe, when on a trailer, shall be parked on a public street for a period of time exceeding 48 hours, and when so parked shall be located no nearer to an intersecting street than 100 feet, from the intersecting curb lines of the two streets nor located so as to obscure any driver's view of approaching traffic. No nonmotorized travel trailer or boat or canoe, when on a trailer, shall be left unattached when parked on a public street. (Code 1979, 20-1120, 20-1422)

17-417

HABITUAL VIOLATOR OFFENSE; \$50.00 FINE.

- (A) It shall be a separate municipal offense to park a vehicle in a City parking lot or at a metered location on a public street, if both of the following conditions are present: (Ord. 7681)
- (1) The vehicle is parked unlawfully at a meter pursuant to Section 17-304 et seq. or is parked unlawfully pursuant to Section 17-414 et seq. in an off-street parking lot, and
 - (2) the vehicle has received five (5) or more notices of violation pursuant to Sections 17-304 et seq. or Section 17-414 et seq. within a period of the previous thirty (30) consecutive days.
- (B) It shall be a defense to a citation received pursuant to subsection (A) that the vehicle was improperly issued a fee notice pursuant to the City Code, and because of such improper issuance of the fee notice the vehicle has not

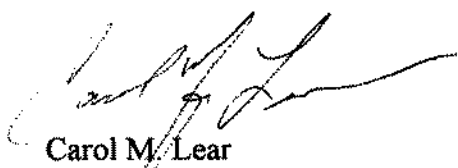
We the undersigned, upon our oath, duly swear to the following:

1. That we reside at 519 N. Perry;
2. That we have been made aware of a proposal to place additional "No Parking" signs near the intersection of 4th & Perry, on that side of the street where the commercial building commonly know as the Research Facility is placed (NW corner);
3. That our neighbors residing on the NE corner (NE neighbors) occasionally park a vehicle near the NW corner;
4. That our NE neighbors have always been neighborly towards us, having recently intervened to save Patti Petersen-Klein and her two small dogs from a loose pitbull;
5. That any parking disputes, if any should be resolved first by asking the NE neighbors to move the vehicle;
