## A RESOLUTION IN SUPPORT OF THE PROPOSITION OF A CITY ORDINANCE BANNING MARIJUANA AND PARAPHERNALIA POSSESSION

1 2 3	WHEREAS,	the City of Lawrence currently has no ban on the possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia, requiring that all cases arising with Lawrence City limits are directed to District Court, and	
4 5 6 7	WHEREAS,	the creation of this ordinance by the Lawrence City Commission would allow these cases to be prosecuted in municipal courts, and	
8 9 10 11 12	WHEREAS,	in the 1998 Higher Education Act, section 484(r) denies or delays by a minimum of one year students with drug convictions from receiving federal financial aid; however, this only applies to convictions under state or federal as opposed to municipal law, and	
13	WHEREAS,	both the cities of Topeka and Wichita prosecute these cases at the city level, and	
14 15 16 17	WHEREAS,	the denial and/or delay of financial aid after being convicted of possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia is a severe detriment to the ability of students to rebuild their lives and become productive members of society, and	
18 19 20	WHEREAS,	denial of one year's worth of financial aid can result in a student's inability to continue their education and disrupt an entire lifetime career plan.	
21 22 23 24 25 26 27	THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the University of Kansas Student Senate here assembled that we support action by the Lawrence City Commission to move jurisdiction over first time marijuana and paraphernalia possession cases to Lawrence municipal court with the proposition of a city ordinance on Marijuana and Paraphernalia Possession. We support this specifically because it will prevent students from losing financial aid for first-time marijuana and paraphernalia offences.		
28 29 30 31	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that Student Senate takes no official stance on efforts to "decriminalize" marijuana possession or otherwise reduce penalties below current levels.
